

Gift and Endowment Details:

All gifts to the Bishop Scholarship Endowment will be split into two parts; 80% will go into a permanent restricted endowment. These funds will be managed as a part of the College's endowment and are under the authority of the College Board of Trustees.

The other 20% of the gift will be put into a non-permanent account to be used for Bishop Scholarship while the permanent Endowment reaches its goal of \$1,000,000 and generates earning to provide yearly funds.

When the Endowment goal is reached, the Institutes Endowment policy will direct a yearly withdrawal of 5% of the last three years average. This will provide \$50,000 a year for Bishop Scholarships.

Hilary Mawia graduated in 2008 and is originally from Yangon, Burma. She recently graduated from Ben-Hurion University of the Negev with her medical degree.

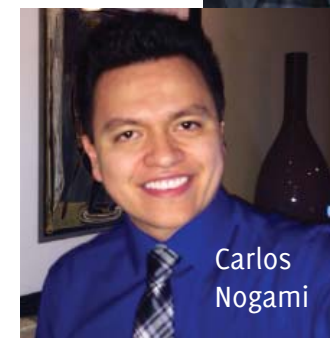
